This Wednesday, February 14th, is Ash Wednesday and it marks the beginning of the season in the church year known as Lent. Lent is indeed a time of fasting and prayer.



However, the deeper purpose of all Lenten practices is two-fold. First, it is the one time during the church year we are called to remember that we are human beings, imperfect, sinful and fully dependent on God. We are dust and one day, we will return to the dust. Second, we are called to remember the new life offered to us through Jesus, and all the possibilities opened to us by the power of the Holy Spirit. Why a two-fold focus we might ask? The answer is because each of these practices reminds us who we are, and to whom we belong. Our Lenten practices help us remove all obstacles that keep God from working through us and in us.

If we choose to observe a Holy Lent with spiritual practices, what we choose will be unique to each of us, and open us up to self-examination. For some, giving up something we enjoy might be a way we remember our mortality and dependance on God, or a way to remember those who go without. Practices can also be taking something on, like scheduling prayer and reading scripture each day, or serving in the mission field. This is a solemn but holy season because we are invited to walk alongside Jesus as he makes his way to the cross. As we walk with him, let us acknowledge to him our shortcomings, and take the path towards our own repentance. Our journey towards Easter and resurrection must begin with accepting that we are dust and to dust we will return. On Ash Wednesday, we wear the sign of ashes on our forehead. Wearing Ash is a biblical symbol of mourning and penitence and an ancient sign of the fragility of human life. It marks the penitence of the community of faith while also pointing towards the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

The sanctuary will be open for prayer and meditation Ash Wednesday from 9-5:30. The pastor will be available in the office for those who would like to partake of communion or imposition of the ashes.

Words from the Pastor

I cannot express how wonderful it is to begin communicating once again in a church newsletter. Just a few weeks after my arrival at WEPC, there were many unexpected challenges. There seemed to be a great deal of loss as well. However, the Holy Spirit leads on and we have many things to be grateful for that grew out of these challenges. For me, today, I am so very grateful we have found Carol Moss, who in the short time she has been with us, has been a wonderful addition to our church staff. Even as we are grateful for what God has done, we can agree these challenges have made the transition in leadership very difficult. Getting to know a new pastor and getting in step together in ministry is never easy. Transitions of any kind are difficult but transitions that involve building relationships takes patience, time, and prayer. In my studies I read this little example of church/pastor expectations....

"Church Member describing the ideal pastor: is 29 years old, has 30+ years of experience, loves the older folks of the church, visiting them regularly, spends all of his/her time with the young people of the church, is always available to anyone who drops by for a friendly conversation, gives all her/his attention to the ill and shut -in, is always in the church office when you need to find him/her, is always at the hospital seeking to comfort the sick and afflicted, never misses any church activity and on and on.

A Pastor describing the ideal church member. The member: is 29 years old, has degrees in law, accounting, business, personnel management, and vocal performance, has a high-paying career and pledges 25 percent of income to the congregation, sings in the choir, but has no need to solo, respects the pastor's knowledge and never questions the pastor's wisdom, pays attention during sermons and laughs at the right places, nods sagely at the right places, and goes home remembering all three points and applies them during the week, gives all her/his attention to the elderly, ill, and shut-in, never needs a pastoral call for sickness, spiritual counseling, or personal problems, always says yes to serving on committees when asked, never misses any church activity and so on..."

WEPC, like all pastors, I wish I could be everything to everyone. I wish I could be at every event, every meeting, every difficult moment, and every celebration. I wish I was liked if not loved by everyone, able to heal every wound, sooth every broken heart, nurture every meet every need, say the right thing every single time. I may wish I could be all these things but I know, I cannot. My role as pastor is actually to point to Jesus who is all those things and more. And, while I may wish, at times, for the perfect, know-all, do-all church member, the truth is I see new gifts, talents, and possibilities in each one of you every day—just as you are.

Building relationships together in ministry is a commitment that ultimately brings about the kingdom of God in the world by way of flawed individuals—by the saving grace of a perfect Savior.



Opportunities for Lenten Study & Spiritual Practices







Lent 2024: Rooted in God's Love

Lent starts this year on Valentine's Day, February 14th. Though Valentine's Day isn't a religious holiday, the convergence is significant. Lent is a time of dedication to the Lord. What does it mean to anchor yourself in love and in God this Lent? As we think of Lenten discipline we might naturally associate it with shadows, emptiness, and suffering. Yes, these are elements of the Lenten journey, to be sure, but so is love. How will you take on a Lenten practice that is rooted in love this year? Here are three ideas for you.

- 1. Lovingkindness Meditation You can do a simple search to find many scripts for this, but the basic idea is to think warmly first toward yourself, then toward someone you love, and finally toward an enemy. A few minutes per day makes a significant difference.
- 2. Practicing Self-Compassion Every morning say to yourself "I am God's beloved child. God loves me unconditionally." Sounds simple, but how often do we neglect to extend love and hospitality to ourselves? Children seem to be better at this, though they too can struggle. If we are to remind them of their worth, we must see it in ourselves first.
- 3. Scripture Memorization Many of us know the beautiful and familiar words of 1 Corinthians 13 that begins "Love is patient. Love is kind." This love is not referring, specifically, to romantic love, but rather God's perfect love. Perhaps you'll want to memorize the whole chapter this Lent? How would that change your spiritual practice? Flower Sign Up For Worship 2024


