Words from the Pastor

Dear WEPC,

During the past few weeks, I have been preparing myself for a few days of continuing education time. I have asked colleagues and friends in ministry for recommendations. I have selected the books and materials that I will actually have time to read from a rather long list of "books I hope to read one day". And, I have the devotions, wise words and memoirs that will be my spiritual food. As trivial as this may sound, we pastors, the teaching elders of the church, love the time we have to focus our attention completely on study and prayer. During my preparations, I was reminded of a quotation of Howard Thurman on the "growing edge".


He writes, "Look well to the growing edge! All around us worlds are dying and new worlds are being born; all around us life is dying and life is being born. The fruit ripens on the tree, the roots are silently at work in the darkness of the earth against a time when there shall be new leaves, fresh blossoms, green fruit. Such is the growing edge! It is the extra breath from the exhausted lung, the one more thing to try when all else has failed, the upward reach of life when weariness closes in upon all endeavor. This is the basis of hope in moments of despair, the incentive to carry on when times are out of joint and men have lost their reason, the source of confidence when worlds crash and dreams whiten into ash. The birth of the child — life's most dramatic answer to death — this is the growing edge incarnate. Look well to the growing edge!"

The Lenten season is the one time during the church year that we Christians look more closely at our finite selves, and that is never easy. I can be even more difficult when Lent and difficult life situations take place at the same time. The beauty of Lent is that its dual purpose includes looking forward with resurrection hope. This very special hope inspires, creates, encourages, loves, believes in miracles, and is itself new life. So, I challenge each of us to look for the growing edges in our lives this week. Where might we see God glimmers shining through the clouds and are there signs of new growth? Are there growing edges in the places and people that we least not expect? What will we see God doing around us if we take time and look.

Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Isaiah 43: 18-19

March is Colon and Rectal Cancer Awareness month. Dr. Sam Heathcote is working to bring awareness to the prevention and treatment of the disease. He is a fellow trained Colorectal Surgeon with Pinehurst Surgical.

The Heathcote family joined as members of WEPC last fall and we are so happy they have joined our church family.

The Heathcote family moved to Seven Lakes in the Summer of 2021 when Sam took a job as a Colorectal and General Surgeon with Pinehurst Surgical (reminder to get your routine colonoscopy!). Megan is a Financial Advisor (insurance and investments) and continued her job working with Northwestern Mutual from home.

"As we became more ingrained in the community, the last piece missing in our lives was to find a church. Megan comes from a long line of Methodist ministers and Sam was raised a Presbyterian; after researching churches in the area, we settled on trying WEPC in the Summer of 2023. We immediately felt a connection and were excited to join later in the year. We look forward to getting to know the congregation better and growing in God's plan for us all."

The Heathcote family would like to encourage you to take care of yourselves as you all take care of each other and our community. Colonoscopies are recommended to start at age 45, earlier if there is a family history. Preps for Colonoscopies have also gotten a lot better and easier to manage. So if you have been putting off this routine healthcare (or any other medical needs) please talk to your healthcare provider today! Colon cancer is preventable, treatable, and beatable!
